# Update on Restoration of Dams in Satara

On 7th May 2025, the RCPC Team visited various sites under the Satara Dam Project to review both completed and ongoing work. The visit was led by Rtn Giri Sakhrani and included IPP Cmde Ajay Chitnis, PE Rtn Lekha Nair, Rtn Shirish Nadkar, R'Ann Mukta Nadkar, R'Ann Teena Goyal, along with young participants Arnav, Kavin, Tanvi, and Tanay, and Mr. Padmakar (Bandu) Bhide.

At a lake near Velu Village, de-silting and excavation work was actively underway to increase the lake's depth and enhance water retention. The team also visited Bhosare, where Deep Continuous Contour Trenches (CCT) were being dug. This technique involves creating trenches along natural contours of the hillside to slow down surface runoff and allow water to percolate into the ground, thereby improving groundwater levels across the region.

The group then proceeded to Rajapur Dam, which had been repaired the previous year. Although the lake's water level had decreased significantly, local villagers reported remarkable benefits. Thanks to the repairs, they were able to harvest two crops, their wells remained full, and they hadn't needed a single water tanker in the past ten months. They expressed optimism about managing with the available water supply until June. The joyful faces captured in photos vividly illustrate the positive impact of the Rotary Club of Pune Central's commendable efforts in environmental restoration and water conservation.

Interact, the Rotary youth program, was launched by the RI Board of Directors in 1962. The first Interact club was established by the Rotary Club of Melbourne, Florida. Interact clubs provide opportunities for boys and girls of secondary school age to work together in a world fellowship of service and international understanding. The term, Interact, is derived from "inter" for international, and "act" for action. Every Interact club must be sponsored and supervised by a Rotary club and must plan annual projects of service to its school, community and in the world.

Today there are over 7,200 Interact clubs with more than 155,000 members in 88 countries. "Interactors" develop skills in leadership and attain practical experience in conducting service projects, thereby learning the satisfaction that comes from serving others. A major goal of Interact is to provide opportunities for young people to create greater understanding and goodwill with youth throughout the world.
